Jewish Folklore As Wisdom...Our Customs and Beliefs - 7:30 PM . Joyce Winslow, a fifth grade teacher at WHC and a former professor of English Literature, is an award-winning author of short stories. She will discuss how Hebrew and Yiddish folktales help us "read between the lines" of familiar Bible stories and helped established ethical lessons in changing locations and times.
